DOWLING PROFESSOR CO-AUTHORS BOOK: *THE FINAL WAR—AVOIDING IT THROUGH A NEW HARMONIC SOCIETY*

OAKDALE, N.Y., April 18, 2012—Dr. Elsa-Sofia Morote, associate professor, Department of Educational Administration, Leadership and Technology at Dowling College, has co-authored a new book entitled, *The Final War—Avoiding It Through A New Harmonic Society*.

The book was a result of a collaborative work with imminent scholar Colonel Morote-Solari and Dowling doctoral alumni Patricia Bowens McCarthy.

According to Morote, the book poses two questions and presents two different themes. First, it questions: Are we heading for a war? And, do you think a final war is unavoidable? Secondly, it presents two different themes: war—the historical and strategic events that may lead to a final war; and, harmony—a harmonic philosophy that creates a path to final peace.

The book's website states: *In "The Final War" you will read about: Jerusalem, center of the world; a war scenario with China and United States as unwilling combatants; a harmonic philosophy that can guide us to peace; and an economic system beyond the macro and microeconomics.*
